Introduction

You give SAAI permission to collect and use your personal information when you use the SAAI Web and Portal Site or upon enrolling as a Member of SAAI via our outsourced call centre. SAAI uses your personal information only for internal purposes like improving the functionality of the site, keeping a database of members, and maintaining a record of your access and changes that you as a member make to your personal information. SAAI shall comply with all applicable laws with a focus on the Protection of Personal Information Act (POPIA) concerning the management and processing of personal information. SAAI treats personal information collected for the sites as strictly private and confidential. All personal information collect will only be used for the purpose for which it was collected and will not be further processed without consent from the member/data subject.

SAAI will not share your personal information with any third party without first obtaining your consent unless a court of law orders SAAI to do so. SAAI is committed to all applicable laws that pertain to receipt, storage, and the processing of personal information, and shall remain compliant with these applicable laws as they are amended from time to time with a specific focus on the POPI Act.

You consent that SAAI may share your personal information with contracted Operators for purposes of the processing, management, and administration of all our members Personal Information only.

We collect personal information directly from you, and where lawful and reasonable, we may verify collect personal information about you with contracted Operators, banks, address location services, and ID verification services for the purposes set out below.

Your Consent

SAAI will process your personal information if you give us your consent willingly or in accordance with the law. You give your consent to us for the collection of your personal information through our:

- Awareness Campaigns
- Petitions
- Participation in specific Campaigns
- · Participation in Sport Activities

SAAI will only disclose your personal information if:

- the law requires it.
- we have a public duty to disclose the information.
- our or your legitimate interests require disclosure, or
- you agreed that we may disclose your information.









Storing Personal Information

We store personal information as required by law, within South African in a Private Cloud Infrastructure hosted by Amazon Web Services (AWS) Cape Town. The storage of information is protected with the required security access control and with the necessary IT infrastructure protection.

SAAI Security Practices

Our security systems are designed to prevent the loss, unauthorised destruction, damage, and/or access to your personal information from unauthorised parties.

SAAI Cookies Practices

This SAAI site uses cookies – small text files that are placed on your machine to help the site provide a better user experience. In general, cookies are used to retain user preferences, store information for things like shopping carts, and provide anonymised tracking data to third-party applications like Google Analytics. As a rule, cookies will make your browsing experience better. However, you may prefer to disable cookies on this site and others.
